



Summary for Travel to White Pearl Resorts, Mozambique

Mozambique is open for international and regional travel through Maputo International Airport and Rossana Garcia Border (Komatiepoot Border) from 15 November 2020, subject to the below conditions

- All arrival travellers to Mozambique are required to have a negative COVID-19 PCR test clearance certificate that is less than 72 hours old.
- Travellers testing negative during the arrival screening protocol may continue with their journey within Mozambique.
- Should travellers show any COVID-19 symptoms during the arrival screening protocol, a mandatory 14 day quarantine will be imposed at an approved safe facility within Mozambique and at the travellers expense.
- Departure travellers do not require any further COVID-19 PCR test clearance certificate unless they are travelling to a country that requires a valid negative COVID-19 PCR test clearance certificate that is less than 72 hours old. In this situation, a COVID-19 PCR test may be administered in Maputo City at a registered medical facility or at White Pearl Resorts by a registered nurse from Lenmed Private Hospital. The test is \$65 per test and at the travellers expense. Test results are issued within 48 hours of administration. We advise travellers to present the test clearance certificate together with the receipt received for the payment made. This is to validate that the test administered is legitimate.
- For travellers re-entering South Africa, a negative COVID-19 PCR test clearance certificate that is less than 72 hours old will be requested by the South African Government. Therefore a new test conducted in Mozambique is recommended.
- Should you return to South Africa without a valid test clearance certificate, you will be required to conduct one at the border at a cost of R600 per test.
- Children under the age of 11 years do not require a COVID-19 PCR test clearance certificate however as White Pearl Resorts, we recommend including the children to avoid any delays while at the border due to misunderstanding that may occur.

**We have been informed by self-drive travellers that they were not requested to produce a new test at the South African border control on re-entry into South Africa however as White Pearl Resorts we are unable to confirm this or endorse this as the requirement by Law is a negative COVID-19 PCR test clearance certificate that is less than 72 hours old.*

Kindly note that this is the most current information received as at 05 November 2020 and White Pearl Resorts cannot be held accountable for any information that was not received post the date stipulated.
